MARTINSBURG, WV – Berkeley County Prosecuting Attorney Catie Wilkes Delligatti announces today that a Berkeley County jury has found KEVIN C. HAMILL, 29, of Winchester, VA, and COURTNEY L. HAMILL, 19, of Inwood, WV, guilty of the First Degree Murder, Burglary, and Conspiracy to Commit Robbery arising from a January, 2017, shooting in Martinsburg. Guilty verdicts were also returned convicting KEVIN C. HAMILL of the felony offenses of Grand Larceny and Person Prohibited from Possession of a Firearm and COURTNEY L. HAMILL for an additional count of Burglary. For KEVIN C. HAMILL's convictions, he faces a life in prison without the chance of parole. For COURTNEY L. HAMILL's convictions, she faces life in prison with the possibility of parole after fifteen years as the jury recommended mercy upon her conviction of First Degree Murder. The three day trial was held before the Honorable Judge Michael D. Lorensen, of the 23rd Judicial Circuit. Sentencing in these matters is scheduled for June 4, 2018 at 10:00 a.m.

Berkeley County Prosecuting Attorney Catie Wilkes Delligatti and Chief Assistant Prosecuting Attorney Benjamin M. Hiller prosecuted this matter on behalf of the State. The Martinsburg City Police Department investigated this matter and the Berkeley County Prosecutor's Office wishes to thank the Martinsburg City Police Department for their dedicated work over the course of this investigation and in bringing justice to the friends and family of Ramon Walker.
