MARTINSBURG, WV – Berkeley County Prosecuting Attorney Catie Wilkes Delligatti announces today that a Berkeley County jury found JOSHUA SHAINÉ MOORE, 27, of Alameda, California, guilty of Possession with Intent to Deliver Marijuana, Transporting a Controlled Substance Into the State, and Conspiracy to Commit Possession with Intent to Deliver Marijuana arising from a traffic stop on December 27, 2016 in which approximately twelve pounds of Marijuana was recovered. MOORE faces a penalty of incarceration for not less than one (1) year nor more than five (5) years, or a fine of not more than \$15,000, or both for the conviction of Possession with Intent to Deliver Marijuana; a penalty of incarceration for not less than one (1) year nor more than five (5) years, or a fine of not more than \$15,000, or both for the conviction of Transporting a Controlled Substance into the State; a penalty of incarceration for not less than one (1) year nor more than five (5) years, or a fine of not more than \$10,000, or both for the conviction for Conspiracy. Sentencing will be at the Court's discretion, a Sentencing hearing has been scheduled for August 20th, at 1:00 p.m. The two day trial was held before the Honorable Judge Michael D. Lorensen of the 23rd Judicial Circuit.

This matter was investigated by the West Virginia State Police, Eastern Panhandle Drug & Violent Crime Task Force, and ATF. This case was prosecuted by Berkeley County Assistant Prosecuting Attorney Kevin J. Watson. Ms. Delligatti would like to thank all law enforcement agencies in this successful effort to stop the interstate transportation of drugs into our community, and the jury for carefully weighing the evidence and providing a verdict that achieves justice on behalf of the community.
